Enhancing visibility

EFRR enhances its visibility by holding its biannually congress, but also by giving talks and holding presentations in various conferences and congresses. These include the discussion of findings of recent research as well as discussions on future challenges in rehabilitation sciences, emphasising multidisciplinary research with contributions of various rehabilitation professions.

Our website is regularly updated and aims to serve as a source of information on EFRR and also on its current and upcoming activities.

We make efforts to publish the EFRR activities in peer reviewed journals.

Enhancing networking

Setting up partnerships and cooperation with other European associations in the field of rehabilitation is very important for EFRR. Through cooperating partners such as ESPRM, ISPRM, Mediterranean Forum on Physical and Rehabilitation Medicine, and Baltic Forum on Physical and Rehabilitation Medicine, International Social Security Association (ISSA) Special Work Group on Rehabilitation, UK Society for Research in Rehabilitation we share and distribute knowledge on rehabilitation services and rehabilitation research in Europe.

Gaining importance

EFRR Council pays special attention to its research activities. Furthermore, it also acts as a forum for career - young researchers, who are especially encouraged to get more involved in the field of rehabilitation e.g. by participating in summer schools, workshops, or also contributing in the biannual EFRR congress (e.g. through work-in-progress sessions).

Increasing income

EFRR is a non-profit organization, the members of which contribute on a voluntary basis. The main income of EFRR comes from membership fees, which are deliberately kept low to enhance inclusion. Increasing the number of EFRR members is, therefore, very important in order to ensure running more activities in the field of rehabilitation. The EFRR Council has agreed to accept all participants of the biannual congress as EFRR members for two years after the congress. Further fundraising activities include incomes from summer schools and workshops as well as donations.
